

Breakdown of the mica market by end-user



Mica is a versatile mineral known for its shimmering effects, heat resistance and electrical properties. It finds its way into an array of products ranging from eyeshadow, batteries and electrical components to automotive coatings and building materials.

The Mica Challenge

Primarily extracted in India and Madagascar, mica serves as a lifeline for thousands of families in isolated regions where mining often represents one of the few economic opportunities. However, the challenges of isolation, insecurity, extreme poverty, and the constant informality of the sector lead to the association of mica mining with issues such as child labor and poor working conditions.

INDIA:

Mica production: 130K tons/vear (25% of global mica supply) Child labor: 10% of workforce **Industries** supplied: cosmetics, paints, automotive, electronics



MADAGASCAR:

Mica production: 70K tons/year Child labor: 50% of workforce **Industries supplied:** automotive, electronics



A COALITION FOR ACTION AND IMPACT

Collaboration among all stakeholders in the mica ecosystem from governments and industry players to NGOs and local communities is essential to address the many issues related to mica extraction and implement sustainable solutions that will ensure the wellbeing of mica-dependent communities. The Responsible Mica Initiative (RMI) emerged in 2017 as a force uniting all these stakeholders to eradicate child labor, improve working conditions and build fair and transparent mica supply chains. At the start of 2024, the RMI had over 100 members committed to supporting this shared vision.

RMI began its programs in India's Mica Belt, which straddles the border between the states of Bihar and Jharkhand, and has since extended its work into southern Madagascar and India's two other mica-producing states of Andra Pradesh and Rasjasthan. Drawing on the expertise and resources of various stakeholders including human rights experts, local NGOs and industry members among others, RMI aims to bring about significant change and improve lives and livelihoods in mica mining communities. Recognizing the need for a comprehensive approach, RMI has developed three interconnected program pillars to address the root causes of child labor and poor working conditions.
